We are excited to begin our new 2016-2017 Sunday School year. Please join us on September 11, as we start the new year with a breakfast and program, downstairs, at 9:30 a.m. We will enjoy a delicious breakfast, have an opportunity to meet our new Sunday School teachers, and hear all about the exciting plans for the year. Please sign up in the parlor if you plan on attending. Our new classes will begin on September 18. We have classes for all ages—from tots to adults.

Children's Sunday School

Each Sunday morning, the Sunday School students meet in the sanctuary at 9:45 a.m. for an opening. At this time, the students will recite the Pledge to the Christian Flag and to the Bible. They will have a short devotion, followed by a time of prayer. We take an offering each week. It is used for several different programs:

- We sponsor a child through Compassion International. We send a monthly check to Compassion International to assist in the basic needs of our sponsored child.
- Part of the offering is used to assist the Samaritan's Purse program, sponsored by Franklin Graham. We send offerings to this program several times a year, to be used where needed most.
- Part of the offering is used for the work of our own church. The children learn that it is "more blessed to give than to receive".

At 10:00 a.m., the classes are dismissed to their classrooms. Class time ends at 10:45 a.m. Parents, please note, if you have a child in the 3rd grade or below, you must pick your child up from their classroom by 10:45 a.m. Thank you.

Opportunities to Give

At St. Andrew, we have a few different accounts where you can give above and beyond your tithe to help with the ministry of the church. Here are the variety of accounts (in no particular order).

Capital Campaign: Giving to this fund continues the process of saving money for the expansion of our existing building. You can give to this through the Administrative Committee, marking your regular weekly envelopes, or by using the offering envelopes in the pew and designating the envelope as "Building Expansion fund".

Food Bank: Every second Sunday of the month, we take a Food Bank offering to help with the ministry to the working poor through the Food Bank.

Scholarship Fund: We have a fund set up to help our youth to attend Presbyterian, Synod, and General Assembly gatherings (this includes summer camp). You can give to this fund through the Christian Education Committee and one can apply for this money from this fund through the Christian Education Committee. A person can apply for up to \$100 through this fund each year.

Marie Price College Scholarship Fund: This fund was created as a memorial to Marie Price who was the wife of Norman Price, the pastor at St. Andrew for almost thirty years. This fund is to assist our college students with their expenses. Each college student can apply to receive a \$100 scholarship. Application is made through the Witness and Mission Committee.


