Dear Friends,

Easter is over. Now what? In the Gospel of John, the disciples had the same question—now that Jesus has risen from the dead, what does that mean to me, to us? Since they did not know what to do, they went back to the one thing that they knew for sure—they went fishing. (John 21:1-3).

Jesus came to them and gave them instructions concerning what comes next. In the Gospel of John, when Jesus was talking to Peter, about what to do now that the resurrection was a reality, Jesus said to, “Tend my lambs and feed my sheep.” That task comes to us across the ages—now that the resurrection is over, we are to feed the lambs and sheep of God. We are to tend them and feed them by providing Christian education such as Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, and Bible studies. We are to tend them by protecting them from those who seek to injure them. We are to provide food for those less fortunate and help those who are down and out.

Now that the resurrection is over—now what? In the Gospel of Matthew, on the mountain top in Galilee, Jesus gave this charge to us—“Make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.” (Matthew 28:19-20). We are to share the Good News of the gospel. It is our responsibility to live this gospel and then to share it with all those who are in need. We share it in prayer, with words, and in deeds.

What do we do now that the resurrection is over? We are to take our learning opportunities seriously and go to Sunday School, VBS, and Bible Study. We are to live as God has redeemed us to be advocates for those who are hurting, and we are to be lights for those who are in darkness.

May we embrace the opportunities that God presents to us to share and to live as the resurrected ones.

Sunday School Snippets

Toddler Class: The toddlers have been learning about how much God loves them.

Pre-K Class: The Pre-K students have been studying the good works that Jesus has done. Congratulations to **Natalie Knepper** and **Gavin Babb**, who have memorized their Bible verse, “Jesus went around doing good.” Acts 10:38. A big thank you to **Natalie** and **Gavin**, who volunteer to say the blessing before snack each week.

Kindergarten/1st Grade: Congratulations to the following students: **Natalie Farioli**, **Colton McKinley**, and **Lauren Scumpieru**, for memorizing their Bible verse, “Jesus went around doing good.” Acts 10:38.

2nd/3rd Grade: The children are now learning about Elijah and how Israel followed gods. The lesson is, we should trust the Lord God Almighty, the One True God.

4th/5th Grade: The 4th and 5th grade students started a wall to list all the names of Jesus. These are some of the names that the class came up with from the March 4th lesson: Jesus is the—Christ, Light, Word, Eternal King, True God, and Living God. The class is now beginning a study from the Old Testament. They are studying the prophet Elijah, and how he brought them back to the one true God, how he turned to God even when he was fleeing for his life, and the passing of the torch to a new prophet, Elisha. Through these lessons, we have been taught that with God’s help, we can overcome any fear.

6th-8th Grade: The 6th-8th grade class is studying Paul’s journey, and what it means to obey God.

Teen Class: Come and join the Teen Class as they explore God’s Word, using The Blueprint, a Christian magazine designed for teens.



The children started preparing for Easter a month before Easter Sunday. Besides doing Easter crafts and lessons, going on egg hunts, etc., they opened three Resurrection Eggs for the three Sundays leading up to Easter, and the final three eggs were opened on Easter Sunday. Resurrection Eggs are plastic eggs, not filled with candy, but rather with Easter symbols. Each week, we would open up three eggs and talk about how these symbols related to the Easter Story. Here is a summary of the Resurrection Eggs message:

1. Donkey—A lowly donkey was given to Jesus to ride into Jerusalem just before His death and resurrection.
2. Silver coins—Judas accepted 30 silver coins for betraying Jesus into the hands of the Jewish leaders.
3. Passover cup—At Jesus' last supper with His disciples before He died on the cross, He used the cup of wine to explain His death. Christians still drink from a cup to remember Christ's blood poured out for us and our sins.
4. Praying hands—Praying hands remind us that Jesus went to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray with His disciples.
5. Leather whip—After His trial by Pilate, the Roman soldiers used leather ropes, with rocks and metal woven in, to whip Jesus, leaving 39 deep gashes in His skin.
6. Crown of thorns—The soldiers who crucified Jesus placed a crown of thorns on His head so they could mock Him by saying, "Hail, King of the Jews!"
7. Nails—Three large nails were driven into Jesus' hands and feet to nail Him to the cross.
8. Dice—The Roman soldiers used dice to gamble for Jesus' robe.
9. Soldier's spear—Roman soldiers used a spear to pierce Jesus' side when He was on the cross.
10. Linen wrapping—Joseph of Arimathea wrapped the body of Jesus in a linen cloth after He died on the cross.
11. Stone—The huge stone that had covered the tomb was found rolled away.
12. Empty tomb—Jesus' tomb was empty because He rose from the dead!

The Sunday School students and students attending Kids of the Kingdom have been studying the Easter story this past month. We will end our Easter unit by having an Easter Quiz Bowl. The Quiz Bowl is set up like a Jeopardy game board. There are five categories to choose from: Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Garden of Gethsemane, The Crucifixion, and Easter Morning. We don't feature Daily Doubles on the game board, but we do feature Sunday Specials. The students are all given study sheets to prepare for the Quiz Bowl. The morning of the Quiz Bowl, teams are formed. At the end of the game, everyone is awarded a ribbon and a certificate.



On Easter Sunday, the children all received a bag full of colorful jelly beans, attached with the Jelly Bean Prayer. Each color of jelly bean represents a part of the Easter Story. Do you know the Jelly Bean Prayer? If not, here it is:

The Colors of Easter

Red is for the blood He gave.
Green is for the grass He made.
Yellow is for His sun so bright.
Orange is for the edge of night.
Black is for the sins we made.
White is for the grace He gave.
Purple is for His hours of sorrow.
Pink is for our new tomorrows.

A bag full of jelly beans, colorful and sweet,
Is a prayer, is a promise, is everyone's treat.

What Is a Parish and Which One Am I In

Every church member, their family, and people attending on a regular basis are placed in one of twelve parishes. A Deacon is appointed as the Parish Leader. Parishes are set up so you don't get lost in the congregation. It is the duty of the Deacons to minister to those who are in need, to the sick, to the friendless, and to anyone who may be in distress. The goals of a Parish Leader are to provide opportunities for people to know and care for one another. We are to minister specifically to those in need, the sick, and to anyone who may be distressed or lonely.

If you are not already in a Parish and would like to be included, please contact Jen Metz or Pastor Mark. It is also very important that you sign the attendance form in the black book located near the center aisle of each pew. Our church secretary keeps track of attendance, and if you are a member and never sign the book, we might not know you are in attendance. This could cause you to be moved to the inactive list. If you have any questions, comments, or concerns, please contact Deacon Moderator, Jen Metz, 304-676-6849.

Coffee Hours

The Deacons organize the monthly coffee hours. Parishes co-host these. We want the event to focus on fellowship, and not have a feast, but God provides and we end up with plenty of food. The extra food is used by youth group, and for other events held at church during the week. We ask for contributions of fruit, cheese, crackers, donuts, danishes, cookies, and brownies. Casseroles go over quite well, and we have even had yogurt with granola and fruit that was a hit.

Stewardship

Palm Sunday, Holy Week, and Easter Sunday are the busiest times of the church year. Attendance swells during this time as people are drawn to church to hear the message of hope and new life promised by the resurrection. Some folks may come to church throughout the year because of duty or family obligations. Others come because they feel empty, and need to be recharged weekly, which may occur through music, hymns, or sermons. Children enjoy Kids of the Kingdom.

These things do not just happen. Pastor Mark spends lots of time in prayer and preparation to write a sermon and plan the service. He selects the hymns to enhance the sermon's message. The music played by our organist, Kathy McKinley, or anthems sung by the choir, directed by Jeff Clise, are also specifically chosen. Finding appropriate music takes time to research, plan, and practice. Annette Sandell, Director of Christian Education, finds, plans, and prepares Kids of the Kingdom lessons that also match the message of the day. This is especially challenging because there may be one child or a dozen children present. All of these preparations are accomplished so our worship service conveys the message God wants us to hear. From prelude to postlude, one hour of worship on Sunday is the result of many hours of preparation to make our worship experience meaningful and personal.

We are blessed by the high quality of dedicated, hard-working staff members who serve God by using their gifts and talents for God. Staff salaries make up the largest portion of our yearly budget. As good stewards, we are grateful to support our staff with our generous offerings. Everyone is encouraged to support our ministry through gifts, talents, and financial resources. Each year, members and regular attendees are given a numbered box of of-

fering envelopes, allowing them to receive a record of their financial support of our ministry at the end of the year.
