Did you know that Sunday School at St. Andrew is year around? If you have not plugged into a Sunday School class, now is a great time to start. We have classes for all ages, from toddler to two adult classes. One of the adult classes is an in depth Bible Study. They meet in the conference room, and are currently studying Judges. Pastor Mark and Hank Hemphill teach this class. The other adult class meets in the room across from the conference room. This is a discussion oriented class, and uses a book that the class chooses as their Sunday School lesson. Currently they are reading and discussing Lessons From a Sheep Dog, by Philip Keller.

Sunday School starts at 9:45 a.m. The younger grades, toddler to fifth grade, meet in the sanctuary at 9:45 for an opening program, and then are dismissed to their classes at 10:00.
