## *Rooted in Love, Grounded in Grace, Growing for God*

Dear Friends,

Last year, this column of mine in the newsletter focused on how to deepen your faith using the spiritual gifts that we have in our Christian walk. This year, I would like for us to ponder what it means to be a member of a church, or what it means to be attached to a church.

According to the Book of Order of the PCUSA (our guide in terms of how to order the church), being a member means that we “participate in Christ’s mission. A faithful member bears witness to God’s love and grace, and promises to be involved responsibly in the ministry of Christ’s Church.” And then follows a series of 11 statements that explains what it means to be a member.

The first statement is “proclaiming the good news in word and deed.” Our primary responsibility of being a member is to show the good news of the gospel. One of the primary ways in which we show the good news is how we treat each other, and how we treat those who come to church as visitors.

The Church is training ground for us Christians. It is the place in which we learn how to deal with another who is different than us. It is a chance to learn how to effectively practice Christian grace and hospitality. One of the places that churches fail in this is when someone gets offended by another church member.

When we are offended by another, instead of harboring that grudge, go to that person privately and share your hurt. Instead of bringing others into the offense by gossip or sharing your hurt, go directly to the one who has committed the action. Not only is this biblical, but it cuts down on drama in the church and in our lives. It gives us a chance to grow spiritually as individuals and as the church.

When we practice the good news, we allow Christ’s light to shine through us and through the church. Then we become what we were intended, proclaimers of the good news, in word and deed.

**Harvest Hoedown**

Harvest Hoedown will be held on Saturday, October 6, from 10:00 a.m.—4:00 p.m., at Byron Memorial Park. Williamsport Ministerium hosts this fundraiser to raise money for the Williamsport Food Bank. It is the food bank's biggest fundraiser of the year.

Volunteers work in two hour shifts, from 8:00 a.m.—5:00 p.m. Workers are needed in the straw circle to assist scarecrow builders, to organize and maintain the clothing and accessories, watch over purchased scarecrows, and sell pre-made scarecrows. Assistance is also needed to set up, clean up, and transport boxes of supplies. This is a great way for teens to get their community service hours!

We will need teens and adults to help make 50 pre-made scarecrows on September 30, from 5:00—8:00 p.m., at the church. The pre-made scarecrows will sell for \$10 each at the Harvest Hoedown. All money raised from the Harvest Hoedown activities will go to the Williamsport Food Bank.

- Part of the offering is used to assist the Samaritan's Purse program, sponsored by Franklin Graham. We send offerings to this program several times a year, to be used where needed most.
- Part of the offering is to be used for the work of our own church. The children learn that it is "more blessed to give than to receive".

At 10:00 a.m., the classes are dismissed to their classrooms. The classes are dismissed at 10:45 a.m. Parents, please note, if your child is in third grade or below, you need to pick your child up from their classroom by 10:45 a.m. Thank you.
