Dear Friends,

In my column this year, we are looking at what it means to be a faithful member at St. Andrew. The Book of Order (our guide book for how to do things in the church) states that a “faithful member bears witness to God’s love and grace and promises to be involved responsibly in the ministry of Christ’s church.” It then lists out eleven different ways in which one can be responsible in their ministry here.

We have explored the first two: proclaiming the good news in word and deed; and taking part in the common life and worship of a congregation. The third one is lifting one another up in prayer, mutual concern, and active support.

We seek to give you opportunities to do this in a variety of ways. Each week we share prayer concerns in church so that you have a knowledge and basis on which to pray. We share the concerns through the bulletin and also in the Pastoral prayer. We do this almost every week so that you are able to know the concern that is present and then to see how God worked to solve that concern. We also share in the joy of answered prayer so that we can experience the goodness and greatness of God.

Does it make a difference that you may not know the person that we are praying for? In the grand scheme of things, no, because we are being faithful to the call from scripture to make our petitions known to the Almighty God.

In addition to this, we send cards to our shut ins and our college students, adding our prayers as they are unable to attend with us on a regular basis. The Helping Hands gets these cards ready in order to send them out. Anyone is welcome to take the college cards and write a note of encouragement.

On top of this, the Deacons are responsible for a number of families in the church. The Deacons reach out in ministry to those who are hurting, sharing their concern. They also invite the members in their parish to participate in a wide range of church activities.

We seek to be faithful to the call that we share in ministry together. We do this so that we can be faithful to the task of being grounded in grace, living in love and growing for God.

Congratulations to the 15 students who had perfect attendance for the month of September. We are so proud of you, and your parents and grandparents, who bring you each week. Thank you so much for making Sunday School a top priority!

Sunday School Snippets

Toddler Class: The toddlers have been learning that the Bible teaches us all about Jesus, and that God gave us people to love us.

Pre-K Class: Congratulations to **Elsie Majeski** and **Sutton Risley** for memorizing their Bible verse, “He cares for us.” I Peter 5:7. The class has been learning many Bible songs this past month—The BIBLE, Jesus Loves the Little Children, etc. The students have been learning that Jesus wants us to follow Him.

K/1st Grade Class: Congratulations to **Colton McKinley** for memorizing his Bible verse, “This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down His life for us.” I John 3:16. The class has been learning that Jesus knows all about us. We can ask Jesus for help at any time.

2nd/3rd Grade Class: The students have been learning how God created the world. Each Sunday, there is a review of the previous week’s lesson, which leads into the current lesson. The class has been studying the Creation story. The students have praised God for the earth, sun, stars, land, water, and food. They enjoyed the lesson of when God created the animals: camels with humps, zebras with stripes, kangaroos with pockets for joey, elephants with big ears and a long trunk, and giraffes with long necks. The students thought that insects could have been off the list of God’s creation. People have not yet entered the picture.

4th/5th Grade Class: The 4th and 5th grade students have been studying creation and Noah’s flood. The lesson focus points are: God created with power and wisdom and His design showed He also created with purpose and love. Other themes for our lessons have been: We all need correction and should respond with the right attitude when corrected, and sin grieves God, but following God (like Noah), pleases God. As with Noah, God promises to save.



6th-8th Grade Class: The students talked about the story of Cain and Abel, and the consequences of sin. Bad choices have bad consequences. Forgiveness is necessary, yet it does not mean lack of consequences. The class also studied the story of Noah and the flood. They discussed how important it is to stand up for your beliefs even though others around you are mocking you and making fun of you.

Teen/Young Adult Class: This class uses *The Blueprint*, a Christian Teen magazine, as their curriculum. The lessons in the magazine highlight that the Bible is God's blueprint for us. Jesus Christ is the foundation we build our lives upon. Come join this class if you are a teen or young adult, and explore how God wants to make a difference in your life, and how you can make a difference in this world.

On September 30, Sunday School kicked off the Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Project by watching a video explaining the program, and showing children receiving their shoeboxes in years past. The video showed the joy of children all around the world receiving their shoebox filled with toys, hygiene items, school supplies, etc. The students enjoyed Christmas cookies as we discussed how we could bring joy to so many children simply by filling a shoebox. We had a prayer that God would bless the children who would be receiving our shoeboxes. Thank you to Elaine Myers, who coordinates this project for our church, and to all those who filled a shoebox.

Sunday School at St. Andrew has three components:

1. Learning the Word of God: Each week, the children have age appropriate lessons learning God's Word and the love that Jesus has for them. The younger children have crafts and take home papers emphasizing the lessons. The older classes have devotions to take home and bring back to share with the class.
2. The students realize the blessing of giving to those who are in need. Each week, the children bring in their offering. Their offering is used in many ways. We sponsor two children through Compassion International. Every month we send a check to meet the basic needs of our sponsored children. We give part of our offering to Samaritan's Purse. Soon, there will be a poster of some of the many projects that Samaritan's Purse supports throughout the world. Recently, the Sunday School sent a check for hurricane relief. Part of the offering goes back to support the ministry of the church and to our local community. Thank you, parents, children, and teachers, for remembering your Sunday School offering. You truly are making a difference in the lives of so many!
3. Sunday School is fun! We have the best teachers at St. Andrew. They all find such creative ways to teach the lesson, and to memorize Scripture. Prizes and gift cards are awarded when the students have successfully completed their bonus work. Not only do we feed you spiritually with the Word of God each week, we also feed you physically. Carol Erck makes the best homemade snacks each week. The teen/young adult class is equipped with a Keurig machine, with lots of coffee and hot chocolate available.

If you are not yet involved in a Sunday School class, come and join us. There are classes for all ages, tots to adults. There are two adult classes. Pastor Mark and Hank Hemphill teach the Seekers Class, which meets in the conference room. They are currently studying the Book of Acts. The Voyager Class is located across from the conference room. This is an interactive and discussion oriented class. They will soon be studying *One Incredible Savior*, by Max Lucado. 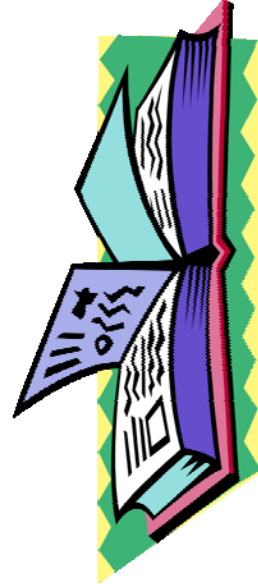

“All gave some, some gave all.” November is a month of patriotism and thankfulness for those who served our country in a variety of ways. Here are a few books that seem appropriate at this time. Spoken from the Heart is an autobiography by Laura Bush of her journey from Midland, TX to the White House, including her public triumphs and personal tribulations. In Unbroken: A World War II Story of Survival, Resilience, and Redemption, Laura Hillenbrand describes the life of Louis Zamperini, a POW who survived the brutality experienced in a Japanese prison. Through a relationship with God, love replaced hate for his tormentors. Five Presidents, written by Clint Hill, a Secret Service agent during five administrations—Eisenhower through Ford, brings history to life as he shares his insider’s perspective of the presidency.
