Rooted in Love, Grounded in Grace, Growing for God

Dear Friends,

In this column this year, we are going to focus on what it means to be a member of, or attached to, a church. Last month, we looked at the fact that as God has given to us, so we are to share this with the Church.

The Book of Order, which defines our day to day activities as a Presbyterian congregation, states that another aspect of being a faithful member means, “demonstrating a new quality of life within and through the church.” This aspect is the most appealing and soul winning aspect and yet is one of the hardest to achieve.

When the world sees that we have learned to love one another, that we take it seriously about the command to love as Christ has loved us, it has great appeal. In a society that is at odds with one another, where anger and discord have become the norm, how refreshing it is when someone sees that people care deeply for one another in the church. By the way, this is our call from Christ and from Scripture, that we do love another more than self.

The reason this is the hardest to achieve is that we need to die to self in order for this to happen. Self in and of itself refuses for this to happen and resists our spiritual desire to be like Christ. This is a daily decision, sometimes an hourly decision to put aside our pride and our desire and to be like Christ. When we make that daily/hourly decision to embrace Christ, then we can push our flesh out of the way in order for the spirit to rule in us.

The best place for us to practice this, obviously, is the Church. Here we speak the same spiritual language and have the same spiritual goal, being like Christ. If we try to do this on our own, then we do not have the challenge of working with others who are on a different spiritual level than us. The end result is that we do not grow as effectively nor as rapidly as when we practice the gift of love here, in the Church.

As the faithful ones, as members and attenders of the Church, when we live out the love of Christ, we show others that we are truly grounded in grace, that we live in love, and are growing for God.

Sunday School Snippets

Toddler Class: The Toddler Class learned all about Christmas and the joy of giving.

Pre-K Class: Congratulations to **Elsie Majeski**, and **Sutton Risley** for memorizing their Bible verse, "A Savior has been born." Luke 2:11. We thank **Elsie** for saying the blessing before we had our snacks.

K/1st Grade Class: Congratulations to: **Colton McKinley** and **Lily South** for memorizing their Bible verse, "Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you, He is the Messiah the Lord." Luke 2:11. The class learned how Joseph obeyed God, and how Joseph and Mary welcomed baby Jesus.

The older students go directly to their classrooms at 9:45. Children in 5th grade and below meet in the sanctuary at 9:45 a.m. At that time, the children have a devotion, say their pledges to the Christian flag and to the Bible. An offering is taken as well. The children's offering goes to support our sponsored child through the organization of Compassion International. Several times throughout the year we support projects through Samaritan's Purse. In December, we were able to send \$100 to Samaritan's Purse to aid in Life Saving Medical Care. Part of the offering is used for the work of the church. Through their giving, the children realize that it is "more blessed to give than to receive". At 10:00, all children are dismissed to go to their classes.

If your child is joining the Youth Choir, their practice time is from 9:40-10:00 a.m. every Sunday morning, in the choir room, with director Mr. Jeff. These children will go directly to their Sunday School classes after choir practice. If you would like to join the Youth Choir, any child in 8th grade or below is welcome to join. We have two great adult classes. Please note the classroom change beginning on February 3.

The Seeker Class meets in the Friendship Hall. This is an indepth Bible Study. Pastor Mark and Hank Hemphill teach this class. Currently, they are studying the book of Acts.

The Voyager Class is an interactive, discussion oriented class. The class chooses the book to read and discuss. Currently, the class is reading The Battle Plan for Prayer. The books are provided by the class, and they are read and discussed during the class time. The class allows ample time for prayer requests and a time of prayer. They meet in the conference room.

We have been doing a Winter theme for Kids of the Kingdom. We have had all kinds of fun doing winter activities, making snowflakes, creating winter collages, drinking hot chocolate, etc. The theme for January has been how special each and every one of us is in the eyes of God. God created each of us unique and special. We paired up this thought with snowflakes.
