Dear Friends,

In this column this year, we are going to focus on what it means to be a member of, or attached to, a church. Last month, we looked at the fact that we are to learn how to be a better Christian in the Church.

The Book of Order, which defines our day to day activities as a Presbyterian congregation, states that another aspect of being a faithful member means, “responding to God’s activity in the world through service to others.” We are called out of the world and into the Kingdom of God in order to make a difference in this world. As Jesus came to touch the world with love, so we are to follow His example to touch the world with love.

We at St. Andrew give you plenty of opportunities to fulfill your responsibility to the hurting world around us. Some of the places in which you can serve are:

- The Williamsport Food Bank has been serving the poor for over 40 years. It meets every Monday and Thursday from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. You can donate food, money, or volunteer.
- The Shepherd’s Table is a ministry meal to the working poor and the lonely in our community. It meets every Thursday evening, from 5:00—6:15 p.m., at Williamsport United Methodist Church.
- Community Action Council in Hagerstown is seeking volunteers to serve in its Food Pantry.
- REACH is the homeless shelter in Hagerstown, and often needs overnight volunteers and those willing to assist in helping the homeless.
- We give backpacks to the disadvantaged in the Williamsport School District, as well as sponsor the Micah’s food program.

If you want to serve in any of these ways, the Witness and Mission Committee oversees each of these outreaches. You can contact the chair, Debbie Kinzer, or co-chair, Steve Hatleberg, to see how you can serve.

In addition to this, you can bring food for the CAC Food Bank, clothing for the Clothing Bank, or items needed for Holly Place.

As the faithful ones, as members and attenders of the Church, when we live out the love of Christ, we show others that we are truly grounded in grace, that we live in love, and are growing for God.

Sunday School Snippets

Toddler Class: The Toddler Class is learning about how Jesus loves us and helps us.

Pre-K Class: Congratulations to **Josiah Kesler** and **Elsie Majeski** for memorizing their Bible verse, "The Lord is God. It was He who made us." Psalm 100:3. We are so proud of Josiah and Elsie for memorizing their Bible verse. You can never be too young to hide God's Word in your heart! The Pre-K Class has been studying how God made families, bodies to serve Him, and senses to enjoy God's world.

K/1st Grade Class: The students have been studying how God made us all different, and how He has a job for each one of us.

Parish Nook

My name is Kelly. I have been a nurse for the past 13 years, and for the past eight years, the Injury Prevention/EMS Specialist. My husband, Dennie, and I were married at St. Andrew in 2002, and attended church here for a few years. We left and attended Otterbein United Methodist Church for a few years. It was there that I fell in love with the Parish Nursing model. This past June, our family transitioned back to St. Andrew. Along with our daughter, Hayden, we are so excited to be back at St. Andrew. I am very excited about being the church Parish Nurse Coordinator, and I look forward to working with you. Each month, I will provide you with some information on one of the health issues that is recognized for the month. Some you may be aware of, and some may be new to you.

This month happens to be one close to my heart. March is National Colorectal Cancer Awareness month. At age eight, I learned what colorectal cancer was, and it would impact my life from then on. At age 12, my father died of colorectal cancer. At age 30, I got my first colonoscopy. Why share something so personal? I know that people don't always want to talk about it, but I also know that a simple colonoscopy procedure might just save my life or yours. If one person reads this information and decides to get screened, we are making a difference in this deadly but preventable and highly treatable disease, when discovered early.

Colorectal cancer is the second leading cause of cancer deaths in the United States, affecting 140,000 new people each year, and killing about 50,000 people each year. It affects both men and women of all ethnic and racial groups. The risk of getting colorectal cancer increases with age. More than 90% of these cancers occur in people age 50 and older; yet the number of younger people being diagnosed is also on the rise.

Colorectal cancer is a cancer that starts in the colon or rectum. These cancers can also be named colon cancer or rectal cancer, depending on where they start. Colon and rectal cancer are often grouped together because they have many features in common. Cancer starts when cells in the body start to grow out of control. Cells in nearly any part of the body can become cancer, and can spread to other areas of the body. Most colorectal cancers start as a growth on the inner lining of the colon or rectum. These growths are called polyps. Some types of polyps can change into cancer over time (usually over many years), but not all polyps become cancer. The chance of a polyp changing into cancer depends on the type of polyp it is.

Why is screening so important? From the time the first abnormal cells start to grow into polyps, it usually takes about 10-15 years for them to develop into colorectal cancer. With regular screening, most polyps can be found and removed before they have a chance to turn into cancer. Screening can also find colorectal cancer early, when it's small and easier to treat. Without screenings, many people will not know that they have precancerous polyps or cancer. Colorectal cancer is a silent killer, and most often the only symptoms people have are NO symptoms. Some people may have symptoms that include: blood in or on the stool (bowel movement), stomach pain, aches, or cramps that do not go away, losing weight and you don't know why. While these symptoms can also indicate other health issues, if you have any of them, you should talk to your physician.



Despite its high incidence, colorectal cancer is unique in that it is one of the most preventable, and if found early, most treatable forms of cancer.

Prevention is important. If you are over the age of 50, get screened regularly. If you have a family history, talk to your physician. Your screenings may begin earlier. I started getting mine at age 30 because my dad was diagnosed at 40. Be physically active. We know our bodies weren't designed to be sedentary. Get up and move each day! Eat well. Our bodies like to be fueled with foods that are close to nature. Decrease your intake of processed foods. Keep a healthy weight. Extra weight can affect all aspects of our health, from our colon to our heart. Don't drink too much alcohol, and if you smoke...STOP.

Don't be afraid! Many people report being afraid of getting screened. Here is a quick rundown. No nuts/berries for a week prior, 24 hours prior you get to stick to a clear liquid diet. The evening before, you are given some sort of prep. Depending on your situation and your physician, the prep may be slightly different. You will be spending the evening at home after you start your prep. The day of the procedure, you arrive, they place an IV in your arm, and you are given a short and lovely little nap. You wake and are sent home until next time. The worst part for me? The clear liquid diet. I like my food and that is always the hardest part. Getting screened is well worth knowing that your colon is healthy, or knowing that something has been detected early. Don't let fear prevent you from getting screened. Have questions? I am happy to answer any you have! Until next month...be well.

Opportunities to Give

At St. Andrew, we have a few different accounts where you can give above and beyond your tithe to help with the ministry of the church. Here are the variety of accounts (in no particular order).

Capital Improvement: Giving to this fund continues the process of saving money for major renovations to our existing building. You can give to this through the Administrative Committee, marking your regular weekly envelopes "Capital Improvement Fund".

Food Bank: Every second Sunday of the month, we take a Food Bank offering to help with the ministry to the working poor through the Food Bank.

Scholarship Fund: We have a fund set up to help our youth to attend Presbyterian, Synod, and General Assembly gatherings (this includes summer camp). You can give to this fund through the Christian Education Committee and one can apply for this money from this fund through the Christian Education Committee. A person can apply for up to \$100 through this fund each year.

Marie Price College Scholarship Fund: This fund was created as a memorial to Marie Price who was the wife of Norman Price, the pastor at St. Andrew for almost thirty years. This fund is to assist our college students with their expenses. Each college student can apply to receive a \$100 scholarship. Application is made through the Witness and Mission Committee, and is renewable.
