Dear Friends,

In this column this year, we are going to focus on what it means to be a member of, or attached to, a church. Last month, we looked at the fact that we are to be in service to one another as the means by which we show the love of Christ.

The Book of Order, which defines our day to day activities as a Presbyterian congregation, states that another aspect of being a faithful member means, “living responsibly in the personal, family, vocational, political, cultural, and social relationships of life.”

Since church membership means that you are proclaiming that Christ is your Lord and Savior, this declaration needs to be reflected in every area of your life—from personal to social to job to political to cultural. As we take Christ into every area of our lives, into all of who we are, we factor our thoughts through the Bible. As we are more familiar with the Scripture, we then apply it to our thoughts about the culture, entertainment, vocational pursuits, politics, family interactions, etc.

We use Jesus as our guide in these matters. It is then that we realize that leading someone back to God is more important than what TV we watch or candidate we support. We realize that our family is a gift to us, and we need to cherish them in the love of Christ, assisting them in learning about and loving Jesus Christ by bringing them to Sunday School, by making Bible Study a priority, by making Sunday worship attendance a regular part of who we are instead of something we do if there is nothing else to do.

As we faithfully serve, we do receive strength to deal with all of the areas of our lives because we are plugging into the strength promised—Christ Jesus. As we are faithful in the areas of our lives given to us, we will shine as Christ’s own. Then God will give assurance that He is working through us and in us as we faithfully discharge the responsibility given to us.

As the faithful ones, as members and attenders of the Church, when we live out the love of Christ, we show others that we are truly grounded in grace, that we live in love, and are growing for God.

Sunday School Snippets

Toddler Class: The Toddler Class is learning about the great things that Jesus did. They are also learning about the importance of prayer.

Pre-K Class: Congratulations to **Josiah Kesler**, **Elsie Majeski**, and **Sutton Risley** for memorizing this month's Bible verse, "Worship the Lord" Psalm 96:9. The children all enjoy taking turns for blessing our food. The students are learning that singing and making music is an important way to worship God. They also learned that we can all give to God, no matter how young we are; and how important it is to listen to God's Word.

K/1st Grade Class: Congratulations to **Natalie Knepper**, **Colton McKinley**, and **Lily South** for memorizing this month's Bible verse, "Worship the Lord with gladness; come before Him with joyful songs." Psalm 100:2. The students learned this past month that we can worship God in many different ways, including giving gladly, reading and listening to His Word, and praying.

2nd/3rd Grade Class: The students are learning about the miracles that Jesus performed. They also learned that Jesus, the Son of man, can forgive sins.

4th/5th Grade Class: Their lesson themes include: that Jesus loves us even though we sin, that He wants us to be in His family, that He can help us with all of our needs, and that knowing the Bible helps us to know Jesus.



6th-8th Grade Class: The students have been talking about Jesus' qualities, achieving goals, and resisting temptations when they come our way.

9th-12th Grade Class: The class is digging deeper into the stories of the Old Testament.

In March, the Kids of the Kingdom learned the reason for celebrating St. Patrick's Day. St. Patrick's Day is usually associated with the color green, shamrocks, leprechauns, etc. The children learned the real meaning of the holiday. Patrick was born in the British Isles. When he was a young boy, he was kidnapped and sold into slavery in Ireland. Patrick escaped and went to France, and studied religion. Patrick decided that he wanted to go back to Ireland to tell the people about Christianity. At that time, Ireland was a pagan nation, and worshipped all kinds of gods and spirits. So great was the love of Patrick for the people of Ireland that he was willing to risk the very real possibility of imprisonment, torture, and death to spread the Gospel to this pagan nation. Since Patrick had lived there for many years as a slave, he understood the language, people, and their customs. Patrick used the shamrock, which is found all over the country, to tell the people about Christianity. He explained that although it is one plant, it has three separate parts. He explained that each leaf illustrates a different aspect of God: God the Father, the Creator; God the Son, Jesus our Savior; and God the Holy Spirit, our Comforter. Patrick died on March 17, 461, and the church made him a saint because of his spreading Christianity to a pagan country.

The Legend of the Shamrock

St. Patrick picked a shamrock out of Ireland's green sod,
And said, "Behold a symbol of the Trinity of God!"

As the students learned the story of St. Patrick, it was a great time to explain the Trinity to the children. We did several crafts that illustrate the concept of the Trinity—God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. One Sunday, an egg was brought in. We saw that it was one egg, but it has three different parts—the shell, the white, and the yolk. We even frosted pretzels and sprinkled green on them just for fun. There was one pretzel, but it had three distinct parts to it.

In April, we will be continuing our Journey of Lent. The children have a Lenten challenge that was sent home in the beginning of Lent. Each day during Lent, the children are to complete one activity on their paper. There will be a special prize waiting for anyone who brings back their completed Lenten challenge. During April, leading up to Easter, we are learning about the great sacrifice Christ did for us when He died on the cross on our behalf..

If you have not had a chance to join a Sunday School class, now is the perfect time. We have children's classes for all ages. There are two great adult classes as well. The Seeker's Class is taught by Pastor Mark and Hank Hemphill. This is an in depth Bible Study. They are studying the beloved story of Ruth. This class meets in the Legacy Hall. The Voyager Class, which meets in the conference room, is an interactive, discussion oriented class. They are currently reading together and discussing The Battle Plan for Prayer. Books are provided for the class members. There is also time for prayer requests. All classes start at 9:45 a.m. and end by 10:45 a.m.



Parish Nurse Nook

Happy April! As the weather starts to warm and flowers start to bloom, April's topic is all about life. April is National Donate Life Month (NDLM). According to the Living Legacy Foundation (LLF) of Maryland, there are currently about 114,000 people in need of lifesaving organ transplants in the U.S., with about 3,400 in need in Maryland. These patients receive a transplant based upon several factors including blood type, tissue type, medical urgency, waiting time, expected benefit, geography, and other medical criteria when a deceased donor is identified.

One donor can save up to eight lives through organ donation, and enhance more than 75 lives through tissue donation. Donation is only considered after all life-saving efforts have been exhausted. Deceased donors can provide tissues, corneas, and organs such as the kidneys, pancreas, liver, lungs, heart, and intestines. The living organ donation process allows living individuals to donate whole kidneys or parts of the liver. This process can drastically cut down a person's wait on the transplant list.

Federally designated organ procurement organizations (OPOs), like The Living Legacy Foundation (The LLF) here in Maryland, coordinate and facilitate organ, eye, and tissue donation. Many OPOs, like The LLF, include services like donor family support, professional education, and community outreach.

I have been lucky in my career to meet many people who have been the recipients of organ donation, and whose family tragedy has resulted in providing life to others. Organ donation can greatly impact a person's life.

How you can help. You can save and enhance lives through donation by saying "yes". You can say yes to donation at the MVA or by registering online at www.donatelifemaryland.org. By registering as a donor, you can give hope to the thousands waiting for a life-saving transplant. Once you register as a donor, share your decision with friends and family. It is important to share this information with family and friends so that they know your wishes to be an organ donor. If you live in Maryland and aren't sure if you are a registered donor, simply look at your driver's license to see if it says "organ donor". Until next month, be well.
