Parish Nurse Nook

Happy February! Love is in the air for many people, or the hopes of finding love. The colors of red and white seem to be everywhere, red roses are in abundance at the flower shops, and of course, chocolate seems to be everywhere!

As a nurse, I tend to think of February in terms of the heart. I think of all the people who have been affected by heart disease, from some of my friends' youngest children to my first experience with heart disease when my grandfather had his first heart attack. Unfortunately, heart disease affects everyone from the smallest of children to adults. This month, I was able to crochet and donate some of the smallest hats in recognition of Congenital Heart Disease month (CHD), a type of heart disease that children are born with, usually caused by heart defects that are present at birth. In the U.S., an estimated 1 percent of babies born each year have CHD. CHDs that affect children include: heart valve disorders like a narrowing of the aortic valve, which restricts blood flow, hypoplastic left heart syndrome, where the left side of the heart is underdeveloped, disorders involving holes in the heart, typically in the walls between the chambers and between major blood vessels leaving the heart, including: ventricular septal defects, atrial septal defects, patent ductus arteriosus, and tetralogy of Fallot, which is a combination of four defects, including: a hole in the ventricular septum, a narrowed passage between the right ventricle and pulmonary artery, a thickened right side of the heart, a displaced aorta. Congenital defects may have long-term effects on a child's health. They're usually treated with surgery, catheter procedures, medications, and in severe cases, heart transplants.

For adults, I think about how to keep our hearts as healthy as possible. These are a few simple tips. You may notice that these overlap with some of my previous articles.

Unwind and connect. Find ways to ease stress. Talk to people you trust.

Work on your weight. It's a plus for your heart if you keep your weight at a healthy level. Exercise at least three to four times a week for 30 minutes at a time. It burns calories and helps keep extra pounds off.

Upgrade your next meal. Favor fruits, veggies, lean protein, and whole grains. Pass on foods that are salty, high in unhealthy fats, or fried. Repeat for the meal after that, and so on, until it's routine.

Rethink your drink. Limit alcohol. Moderate drinking may be OK, but more than that isn't good for your health. What's moderate drinking? Up to one glass a day for women, and up to two glasses a day for men.

Check your numbers. You may have elevated levels of blood pressure, cholesterol, or blood sugar, and not realize it. Your doctor can check all of these things. If any of your numbers are too high, he'll suggest a plan of action. Remember that each month during coffee hour, I am available to check blood pressures and talk about any concerns you have.

Don't smoke. The tobacco habit isn't just bad for your lungs. It also makes heart disease more likely. Remember we have all been affected by someone with heart disease, so this month say a few extra prayers for those who have it and wear red to show yours support for them!

I wish you a happy and healthy February and until next time, be well.
