Dear Friends,

Parish Nurse Nook

Happy June! Hopefully, we will be able to gather soon as a church and celebrate all we have to be thankful for. Last month, we talked about May's awareness topic, Lupus, and the color purple. This month, I encourage you to continue to wear your purple in honor of June being Alzheimer's & Brain Awareness Month. Wearing purple in the month of June is to show support for the millions of people worldwide struggling with Alzheimer's or another form of dementia. It's also a time to recognize caregivers for the unwavering support they provide to those suffering with Alzheimer's and other forms of dementia.

Alzheimer's is a degenerative brain disease that is caused by complex brain changes following cell damage. It leads to dementia symptoms that gradually worsen over time. The most common early symptom of Alzheimer's is trouble remembering new information because the disease typically impacts the part of the brain associated with learning first. As Alzheimer's advances, symptoms get more severe, and include disorientation, confusion, and behavior changes. Eventually, speaking, swallowing, and walking become difficult. There is no way to prevent, cure, or even slow Alzheimer's disease. Though the greatest known risk factor for Alzheimer's is increasing age, the disease is not a normal part of aging. And though most people with Alzheimer's are 65 and older, approximately 200,000 Americans under 65 have younger-onset Alzheimer's disease.

In contrast, Dementia describes a group of symptoms associated with a decline in memory, reasoning, or other thinking skills. Many different types of dementia exist, and many conditions cause it. Alzheimer's disease accounts for 60—80% of dementia cases. Dementia is not a normal part of aging. It is caused by damage to brain cells that affects their ability to communicate, which can affect thinking, behavior, and feelings.

For caregivers, the longest day may seem like every day in their lives, providing aid for activities or daily living like bathing, dressing, and eating. These tasks can become sources of frustration for the person providing the aid as well as the loved one with dementia. Quite often, the only thing in the caregiver's control is their response to the frustrating circumstance. If you know of family or friends who are dealing with these diseases, I encourage you to offer support to them in whatever way you are able. It takes a village for many medical issues, and I am grateful to be part of such an amazing church family who does that each and every day. Safe blessings.
