Rooted in Love, Grounded in Grace, Growing for God

Dear Friends,

During the season of Advent, I have been highlighting the scripture messages as filtered through a classic Christmas movie. We have stood with Charlie Brown and asked what is the real meaning of Christmas. We have watched miracles unfold before our eyes both on 34th street in New York City and in the city of David, Bethlehem. We have experienced how God can use the outcast for His heavenly purposes. We have allowed the love of God to expand our heart to the place of compassion. As we have embraced the Christ child, we have realized that we do have a wonderful life in Christ.

One movie or story that we did not share in this year is probably one of the more renowned of Christmas stories. That would be A Christmas Carol written by Charles Dickens. Publishers of his day did not see value in the story so Dickens self published the book and began sales on December 19, 1843. It sold out in less than a week. He commissioned two more editions which also sold out by the end of the year 1843.

The first stage adaptation appeared less than two months after the book was released. This version opened in London in February of 1844. There were many versions and adaptations—so many that we cannot recount them here.

The story brought forth many phrases that we commonly use today such as "Bah Humbug" and "Merry Christmas." And of course we were given a new villain—Ebenezer Scrooge. Scrooge was a miserly man who had been brutalized by life. As a result, he was a sad man. It wasn't until he encountered the true meaning of Christmas by the visits of three ghosts that he embraced the Christmas spirit again.

The story relates the great Biblical thought that redemption is possible for every person, no matter how damaged they are by life or how sinful they had become. As a result of the love of Christ, the child of Bethlehem, and the courage and forgiveness of the Savior of Calvary, forgiveness is part of the Christmas saga.

This forgiveness allows us to live together as the people of God. We show that here at St. Andrew that we belong to Jesus (rooted in love) when we forgive others (grounded in grace) and thus we are growing for God.

Sunday School Corner

Here's what is happening in Sunday School

Toddler Class: The Toddler Class is learning about the great things Jesus has done.

Pre-K: Congratulations to **Addi Majeski** for memorizing their Bible verse, "Christ is the head of the church" Ephesians 5:23. The students are learning how God gives us the church. Each week we learn about Jesus from the Bible. Together we pray and thank God. Together we can share about Jesus.

Kindergarten/1st Grade: Congratulations to **Kohen Dayhoff** and **Elsie Majeski** for memorizing their Bible verse. Thank you to **Elsie Majeski**, who sang during our Sunday School Opening. We were so blessed by your singing. The students have been studying the Christmas Story.

2nd-3rd Grade: The students have been on a journey through scriptures in the Old Testament, Isaiah and Micah, that put us on alert for a promised Savior. Those we have met so far are Mary and Joseph. We are about to hear some very good news regarding that promise. According to scripture in the New Testament, Luke and Matthew, in a city of Bethlehem we hear the good news from angels telling shepherds of the birth of a baby named Jesus, born in a stable. Baby Jesus will grow to be a great ruler for all people.

4th/5th Grade: The class has been studying the following themes: The birth of Christ was promised long before Christ was born, We can follow God's plan, We celebrate Jesus' birth, We can accept God's amazing gift, Jesus' growth in wisdom is an example for us, and We can identify with God's people (Ephesians 4:25—We are all members of one body).

We had great attendance for November Sunday School with eight stu-6th-8th Grade: dents consistently in attendance. This month we explored several concepts and introduced some new activities called instant challenges. We looked at the concept of pride and as it relates to the tower of Babel. We did an instant challenge where the students were separated into two teams. They had five minutes to construct the tallest structure they could using only tape and five sheets of paper. They were not allowed to talk while doing this. This illustrated the difficulty the constructors of the tower might have had completing it after GOD introduced the different languages. We talked about Abraham's almost sacrifice of Isaac and obedience to GOD. We talked about wealth and riches in the story of Abraham's rescue of the inhabitants of Sodom and refusal to accept the reward from the king. We did an instant challenge where the students were separated into two teams and had five minutes to write a story about what might have happened to Abraham if he accepted the reward. They then had to act it out. Best performance and story won prizes. Lastly, we talked about how to show love for GOD. What if we treated Him like someone we love and were truly with all the time.

9th-12th Grade: If you are a teen but have not joined the Teen Class, come and join us on Sunday mornings. The teens talk about relevant issues and apply biblical truths to their everyday situations. The class has a challenge. Memorize these scriptures and you will receive a \$5 gift card of your choice: I John 4:4, Philippians 4:13, John 3:16, Matthew 5:7, Isaiah 26:3, Romans 8:6, Joshua 1:9, Psalm 4:8, Matthew 5:8. Hope you can join us on Sunday morning!

With the beginning of a new year, we often make resolutions for the new year. How about making attending Sunday School a top priority. We have classes for all ages, from a Toddler Class to two Adult Classes. Sunday School starts at 9:45 every Sunday morning. The younger children start in the sanctuary for a brief Opening. All other classes start at 9:45 in their classrooms. At the Opening, the children recite the Pledge to the



Christian flag and the Pledge to the Bible. They have a devotion each week, followed by taking an offering. The offering is used to support local missions, the organization of Samaritan's Purse, and also sponsoring two children from Compassion International. The Opening closes with prayer requests and prayer. At 10:00, all children are dismissed to their classes. Sunday School is over at 10:45. If your child is in 3rd grade or below, please pick them up from their class at 9:45.

We have two adult classes:

The Voyager Class meets in the Friendship Hall. This is a discussion oriented class based on the book the class has chosen to study. All books are supplies by the Sunday School class. They are currently reading and discussing <u>Desired By God</u>, by Van Moody.

The Seeker Class meets in the Conference Room. This class is an in depth Bible Study. They are currently studying I Corinthians. The class is taught by Pastor Mark and Hank Hemphill.




