Rooted in Love, Grounded in Grace, Growing for God

Dear Friends,

As we make our way through the season of Lent, some have asked if I would discuss how to view and read scripture. So in the next few columns, we will be looking at how to read the Bible effectively.

Two months ago, we looked at some of the basics of the Bible and how to see the Bible in a larger fashion. Last month, we explored what the Bible says about itself. This month we are going to discuss the fact that the Bible is made up of a variety of literary styles and genres.

It is important that when we read the Bible to acknowledge that not all passages are the same. For instance, you would not view history the same as a love sonnet. Here are some examples of this idea of needing to read the Bible based on the context in which you find the Scripture.

Song of Songs is a love sonnet from one lover to another. We would not apply this as how we are to follow God. Listen to one of the famous phrases: "I am the rose of Sharon, the lily of the valley. Yes, compared to other women, my beloved, is like a lily among thorns." (Song of Songs 2:1-2). It is great for a wedding.

In the book of Proverbs, we get instruction on how to choose wisdom over foolishness or evil. An example: "The blessing of the Lord makes a person rich, and God adds no sorrow with it." (Proverbs 10:22). Now we know that the riches of God are not all financial in nature. The blessings are spiritual in nature.

Another example is any of the parables. We hear Jesus talk about sowers and seed and yet we don't literally apply these pictures to our lives concerning the fact that we are to be farmers and that we are to plant literal seeds in a person.

What I am attempting to convey is the idea that context is vitally important in reading the Bible. In order to fully be enriched by the words of the Bible, we need to understand how it was written and why it was written.

Once again, keep a journal of questions concerning certain passages that don't make sense. As you do this, when you read other parts, God will reveal the answers that you need. You can also send these questions to me so that we can discuss what may be there.

As we go deeper in the Word, we truly become rooted in love, grounded in grace, and thus grow for God.

Membership Support

At St. Andrew, we are “Grounded in Grace”. As such, look to the Bible for how to be faithful followers of Christ. As a Presbyterian Church, we are also guided by the Book of Order which states: “Membership in the Church of Jesus Christ is a joy and a privilege. It is also a commitment to participate in Christ’s mission. A faithful member bears witness to God’s love and grace and promises to be involved responsibly in the ministry of Christ’s Church.” That involvement includes actions that sound very familiar:

- Proclaiming the good news in word and deed
- Taking part in the common life and worship of a congregation
- Lifting one another up in prayer, mutual concern, and active support
- Studying Scripture and the issues of Christian faith and life
- Supporting the ministry of the church through the giving of money, time, and talents

As Lent continues, many of us take steps that deepen our faith. These books may enhance your journey with Jesus.

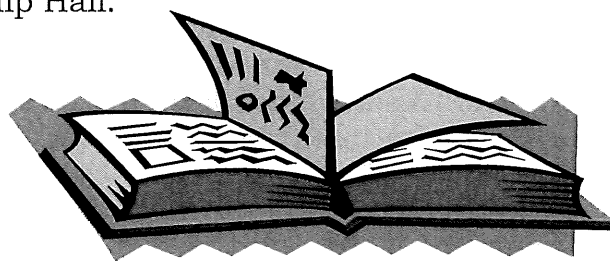
Walk to the cross with Max Lucado:

- And the Angels Were Silent was written specifically for Holy Week reading. Be a witness as you walk with Jesus.
- He Chose the Nails is dedicated to Jesus. The nails, crown of thorns, garment, and other crucifixion items are examined for what they represent.

For Such a Time as This, by Angie Smith, includes narratives of women in the Bible. Each illustrated story includes a three part follow-up. “He” focuses on a characteristic of God shown in the story. “Me” focuses how the story’s truth is evident in the reader’s life. “She” includes a prayer or application. Enjoy!

The Farmer’s Bride Collection offers romance novellas for readers busy with Easter events. Titles are seasonally appropriate beginning with “One Little Prayer” and ending with “New Beginnings”.

Here's What's Happening in Sunday School

Toddler Class: We are learning about our love for Jesus and for our family. Thank you so much to Miss Mel (Nursery Attendant and Toddler Sunday School teacher) for making shamrocks out of pipe cleaners for the Sunday School children to enjoy.

Pre-K Class: Congratulations to these students: **Mason Jamison, Addi Majeski, Michael McDonald,** and **Aiden Paul,** for memorizing their Bible verse, "Jesus went around doing good." Acts 10:38. The class has been learning that we can talk to God at any time. Jesus teaches us about love, He forgives us when we do bad things, and He cares for us when we are sick.

Kindergarten/1st Grade Class: Congratulations to the following students: **Kohen Dayhoff, Elsie Majeski,** and **Sutton Risley,** for knowing their Bible verse, "Jesus is the Son of God." I John 5:5. The students have been learning about how special God's Son, Jesus, is. The lessons emphasize the love and care that Jesus has for each and every one of us. He wants us, in turn, to share the love of Jesus to others. He calls us to follow Him and to be "fishers of men". The students also learned that Jesus prays for us because He loves us. He prays for us to know Him better, for us to stay safe, to have joy, learn more about Him, and to love one another.

2nd/3rd Grade Class: The 2nd and 3rd grade teacher, Miss Carol, recently visited the Holy Land. We are so excited for her to share her amazing trip with the class. The lessons that Miss Carol will be teaching will come alive as she relates them to her Holy Land visit—especially as we approach Easter! While she was away, Miss Pam covered the class. Not only did Miss Pam teach the lesson, go over memory verses, she also taught them catechism question #1: Who is the greatest of all beings? God is the first and greatest of all beings. Thank you so much, Miss Pam, for teaching the class while Miss Carol was away. The class has been studying that no problem is too big for God. He can handle all our worries and concerns. Just for fun, the class painted rocks to remind them we have a rock solid faith in Jesus. They also studied the story of Nicodemus meeting Jesus in the middle of the night. Jesus explained to Nicodemus that he must be born again to be part of God's family. Jesus explained that believing in God we have a new spirit within us that changes our lives.



4th/5th Grade Class: Focus 1: **Jesus wants me to help those in need.** Leprosy was a much feared and isolating disease so that when Jesus touched a man with leprosy in Mark 1:40-45, He showed us an example of compassion, love, and healing. Focus 2: **Jesus can help when we are discouraged.** This event took place at the pool of Bethesda where it was said that angels came and stirred the waters. It was also said that only the first person entering the water would be healed. In John 5:1-15, Jesus healed a man who had been helpless and waiting for 38 years for healing. Focus 3: **Jesus loves us even though we sin.** In Luke 5:27-32, we studied the story of Levi (Matthew), a wealthy tax collector, who Jesus chose to be an Apostle. Focus 4: **Jesus is God's Son and our Savior.** We looked at Isaiah 53:5-6, Matthew 16:13, and I John 4:14-15 to discuss prophecies foretelling the coming of the Messiah. Through Scriptures, God describes the birth and death of His Son, Jesus.

6th-8th Grade Class: We had great attendance for February Sunday School. We talked about a lot of diverse subjects such as Repentance and Change. Such as how we don't need to do it all on our own. GOD is right there with us to move us and encourage us. We talked about setting goals in life and what worthy goals look like. How the goals that the world wants you to measure success by are lies. We looked at how repentance and change are personal. Such as how we can't change others but only lead them to the One who can, Jesus. Lastly, we looked at the concept of Power. The different types of power and how GOD has the ultimate power. Some Scripture we looked at: Luke 5:1-11 and Matthew 9:9-13.

9th-12th Grade Class: The class has been studying relevant scripture and discussing how to apply it to their everyday situations. The class challenge is to memorize the following scripture: I John 4:4, Philippians 4:13, John 3:16, Matthew 5:7, I Peter 5:7, Isaiah 26:3, Romans 8:6, Joshua 1:9, Psalm 4:8, and Matthew 5:8. Those who memorize these verses will receive a gift card of their choice. If you are a teen and haven't come to this class yet, why not do so now?

Sunday School

We have Sunday School for all ages. If you have not joined a class, now would be the perfect time! All classes are from 9:45-10:45 a.m. The younger children, 5th grade and below, meet in the sanctuary from 9:45-10:00 for a brief Opening. During the Opening time, the children recite the pledge to the Christian flag, pledge to the Bible, have a brief devotion, and a time of prayer. Before leaving for class, an offering is taken. Parents, please note, if you have children in grade 3 or below, please pick them up from their classroom. If you have any questions about class locations, or anything else, please see Annette or Pastor Mark.

There are two adult classes to choose from. The Voyager Class is an interactive, discussion oriented class. They have just started reading and discussing the book, Noah Built His Ark in the Sunshine. The books are provided for each class member. This class meets in the Friendship Hall.

The Seeker Class is an in depth Bible Study taught by Pastor Mark and Hank Hemphill. They are currently studying I Corinthians. The class meets in the Conference Room.



Kids of the Kingdom

We finished our Winter Unit by playing Winter BINGO. In January the theme was, We are Created Unique and Special by God. As the Bible says, "You are wonderfully and fearfully made." We did a lot of snowflake activities. If God took the time to create each snowflake different, how special are we that He created us all different and unique. In February, the theme was Love, appropriate for the month with Valentine's Day. We talked about how much God loves us, and in return how we are then to love one another. The theme in March was The Trinity. The children learned the story behind St. Patrick's Day. The shamrock was used to tell the people of Ireland about the Christian faith. The shamrock is one plant, but has three leaves, just as our faith has one God but three different parts, God the Father, the Creator, God the Son, Jesus Christ, and God the Holy Spirit. The children were able to decorate their Winter BINGO cards before playing BINGO. As a reminder of our Winter Theme while playing BINGO, the markers were all little snowflakes, hearts, and shamrocks.

We will now be starting our Easter theme. The students were given a Lenten Activity book. Any child who completes the book and brings it back will receive a \$5 gift card of their choice. If you are in 5th grade or below, come and join us each Sunday after the children's sermon. We will be doing a lot of fun Easter crafts and activities that go along with our Easter lesson.

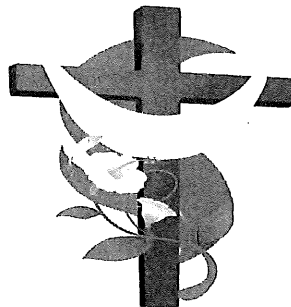
Holy Saturday

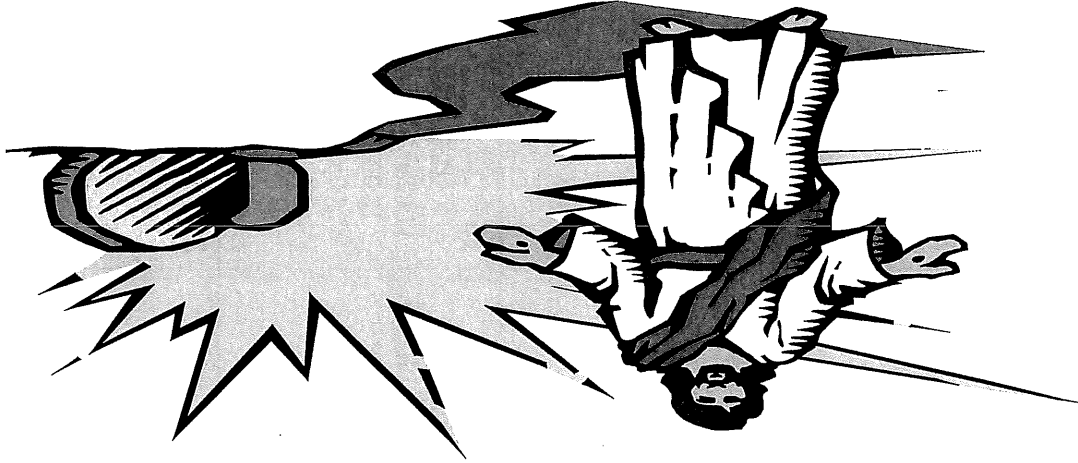
