Dear Friends,

As we enter the season of Pentecost, some have asked if I would discuss how to view and read scripture so we will be looking at how to read the Bible effectively.

We looked at some of the basics of the Bible and how to see the Bible in a larger fashion. The Bible is clear that it is God's Word to us. It does not simply contain the Word of God. It is God's Word. We explored what the Bible says about itself. We have also examined the fact that the Bible is made up of a variety of literary styles and genres. Last month we looked at pronouns and the context they bring.

This month we are going to look at the impact of the Bible on the lives of people. Martin Luther was quoted as saying, "The Bible is the cradle wherein Christ is laid." This may appear as a grand thought but it explains much of the human behavior that we see in the Bible previous to Pentecost. Abraham who was called a friend of God was afraid to the point of lying about Sarah being his wife and gave her to a king as a wife. Jacob stole his brother's blessing and cheated him out of his birthright. Moses got angry and shattered the Commandments that were written by the hand of God. Each of these needed someone to correct their ways and forgive them. There are more examples of the heroes and heroines of the Old and New Testament who did not achieve godliness. But Luther's point is that God sent a Savior to correct our course of sin, to forgive us of our mistakes, and to transform us into the godly person that God had intended when He created us.

Each example of failure in the Bible points us to the need of a Savior. Each bad example allows us to understand that God knows that we need a Savior to heal us and lift us.

A.W. Tozer said this about the Bible--"The Word of God well understood and religiously obeyed is the shortest route to spiritual perfection. And we must not select a few favorite passages to the exclusion of others. Nothing less than a whole Bible can make a whole Christian." Indeed the reading of the Bible allows us to grow spiritually and emotionally and intellectually. Daily reading assists us in the process of overcoming our sins and our faults. It cuts the edge off of our personality so that we reflect the Almighty One, so that we look like Jesus.

Once again, keep a journal of questions concerning certain passages that don't make sense. As you do this, when you read other parts, God will reveal the answers that you need. You can also send these questions to me so that we can discuss what may be there.

As we go deeper in the Word, we truly become rooted in love, grounded in grace, and thus grow for God.

Here's What's Happening in Sunday School

Pre-K Class: Congratulations to the following students; **Mason Jamison, Addi Majeski, Michael McDonald** and **Aiden Paul** for memorizing their Bible Verse—Everything God created is good. I Timothy 4:4. The students have been studying about Creation. They are now learning that God provides us with all our needs—food, water and people who love us.

Kindergarten/1st Grade Class: Congratulations to **Elsie Majeski** who shared her gifts and talents of singing with the students during the Sunday School Opening. The students have been learning about Creation. God has given us a beautiful world to enjoy. The students are now studying the life of Moses. God safely got them out of Egypt. God gave Moses laws for us to live by.

2nd/3rd Grade Class: The students have been studying the life of Joseph. Joseph was treated wrongly by his brothers when they sold him into slavery. Jealousy on the part of Joseph's brothers caused them to do such an evil act. While in Egypt, Joseph was wrongly accused and was put into prison. Joseph was freed from prison when he was able to interpret Pharaoh's dream. Joseph's interpretation of the dream was that there would be 7 years of plenty and 7 years of famine. Because of Joseph's dream, Egypt was prepared for the famine. When Joseph's brothers came begging for food, Joseph forgave his brothers. "Do not be afraid, for I am in the place of God. But as for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good." Genesis 50:20. What the students learned from this story is the power of forgiveness and love. Joseph chose to love and forgive his brothers when they came to him. God asked us to do the same to love and forgive—even when it is difficult.

4th/5th Grade Class: The current themes that the students have been studying are #1 Do what you can to make peace with others, based on the story of Jacob and Esau. Romans 12:18, "If it is possible, as much as depends on you, live peacefully with all people." #2 Be careful when you feel jealous of others—this is based on the story of Joseph. James 3:16 "For where envy and self seeking exist, confusion and every evil thing are there." #3 Be faithful to God in all that you do. This is based on the story of Joseph giving God the credit for his gift of being able to interpret Pharaoh's dream. Colossians 3:23 "And whatever you do, do it heartily as to the Lord and not to men. #4 Forgive those that hurt you.



This theme is based on Joseph's actions during the famine with his brothers. Matthew 5:44 "But I say to you, love your enemies, bless those who curse you, do good to those who hate you, and pray for those who spitefully use you and persecute you."

6th-8th Grade Class: Easter! He has risen! The big activity for April was Easter. Sunday School class attendance has been a little light since Easter being that the class was put on trial for rebellion against their Sunday School teacher, found guilty of rebellion, sentenced to death by crucifixion, and thusly crucified. In all, 5 students were found guilty. Their crimes of rebellion included sleeping in class, interrupting the teacher, not listening, not following directions, not participating, throwing things at each other, climbing over tables, and creating an environment not conducive to learning. This teacher is hoping that this class's sentence and punishment will serve as an example to all Sunday School classes in the future to think twice before performing rebellious activities in class. Seriously, we did have a trial, and sentencing, a parade through the streets of St. Andrew, and a kinder gentler crucifixion where the students had a competition to see who could hold their arms up the longest in a crucifixion type pose. The winner received a Sweet Frog gift card. Pictures of the event are on the church website. Just a tiny taste of what Jesus went through three days we call Easter. More fun to come in June!

Teen Class: The students are learning how to take Biblical principles and how to apply them to everyday situations. There is a challenge to memorize the following scripture: I John 4:4, Philippians 4:13, John 3:16, Matthew 5:7, I Peter 5:7, Isaiah 26:3, Romans 8:6, Joshua 1:9, Psalm 4:8 and Matthew 5:8. Those who memorize these verses will be rewarded a \$10.00 give certificate of their choice.
