#### Rooted in Love, Grounded in Grace, Growing for God

Dear Friends,

As we enter the Fall season, it is fair to say that these past two years have been a trial and tribulation for all of us. It is important for us to live into and latch onto the promises of God. For our next series of columns, let us take time to explore what God promised to us. If you have a favorite promise, please let me know that we can incorporate the promise that has touched you into our discussion in this column.

There are many chapters of the New Testament that are rich in promises. The next one that we will look at is Romans 8. Please take time to live into this chapter. Read it and ponder it. Let it speak to you.

This chapter begins with the great affirmation that those who are in Christ Jesus will not receive condemnation. Jesus has set us free from the need to sin, has forgiven us for sin, and thus we are not condemned by God for our sin.

Then we are asked to focus our mind on the things of the Spirit. We are to push out those thoughts related to the things of this world, the flesh. Instead we are to have our mind set on life and the Spirit. The reason for this is that the flesh is a mindset of slavery whereas the Spirit is a mindset of freedom.

There is power in following the Spirit. Or as Paul wrote, "The Spirit of God who raised Jesus from the dead lives in you." The power of the resurrection is available to us on a regular basis. We just need to live into it.

The next aspect that I would like to focus on it the fact that our sufferings are not permanent. In fact, they are there to help us grow into the person that God created us to be. In verse 18, Paul wrote that the sufferings of this present age are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us. Now this could mean the concept of heaven, but it could also mean that God will reveal His love and power in us as we live through our sufferings. Our sufferings reveal the awesome grace and love of the Savior.

Finally, I would like for us to look at the last two verses, verses 38 and 39. Paul reaches his poetic height when he stated that nothing can separate us from the love of God as found in Jesus Christ. It put it better than I can, but in this moment, he highlighted that no matter the force in the world today or ever will be, we cannot be separated from God's love unless we choose to.

May these words touch you and as we go deeper in the Word, we truly become rooted in love, grounded in grace, and thus grow for God.

Option 4: \$35 LIVE or cooked whole lobster only.


Dinners include: twice-baked potatoes, green beans, roll and dessert




