#### Rooted in Love, Grounded in Grace, Growing for God

Dear Friends,

As we close out this year, we Presbyterians have had a vibrant impact in our society. In these columns, we have looked at what makes Presbyterians so unique and impactful in our society.

One of our rallying cries out of the Reformation was Sola Scriptura which means Scripture Alone. Sometimes organizations like the church can add rules and regulations that do not conform to their founding documents. We as a church have a set of founding documents—they are the Scriptures. For us, the Scriptures are the set of rules and responsibilities for the church.

Previously to the Reformation, the church began to add extra items that were not in the Scriptures and then were treated as Scripture. This watered down the Scriptures and then elevated human doctrine. The end result is that the church is not nearly as effective nor as powerful.

We Presbyterians believe in the rule of the Bible since it is the Word of God. As such, all that we do and who we are is informed through the Word of God. If a doctrine or an action does not conform with the Bible, we should not abide by it. If a doctrine or an action is not mentioned in the Bible, then we may proceed with it as long as it does not water down the power of the Word of God.

The manner in which this has power is found in the Christmas story. We know that Matthew's gospel shares the story of Joseph while Luke's gospel shares the story of the Nativity through the eyes of Mary. We know as we pair up the Old and the New, that the birth of the Messiah/Christ was prophesied long before Jesus was ever born. Since we are a people of the Book, we can have confidence that we are sharing the truth as God has shared this with us!

When we share our faith in love with those we know and those we don't, as we share in love, we demonstrate to others that we as a people are rooted in love, grounded in grace, and thus growing for God.

## **Sunday School**

If you haven't joined a Sunday School Class yet, come and join us. Here is a brief overview of our Sunday School Program. All students from Grade 5 and below meet in the sanctuary at 9:45 for a brief opening. (all other classes go directly to their Sunday School class at 9:45). During this time, we recite the Pledge to the Christian Flag and to the Bible, have a devotion, and a time of prayer. We also take up an offering. We use our Offering to support 2 sponsored children from the organization, Compassion Internation. We also send money to Samaritan's Purse, a relief organization that provides food, water, medical supplies, etc. to the neediest areas of the world. Part of the money is used for church and local needs. At 10:00 the students are dismissed to their classes.

## We have 3 Adult Classes for you to choose from:

- \*\* Seekers Class: This is an in-depth study of the Bible. They are studying the book of II Thessalonians. The class meets in the Legacy Hall and is taught by Pastor Mark and Hank Hemphill.
- \*\* Study in Paul: This class is studying the Life of Paul. They are using curriculum from Beth Moore. This is a DVD and book study of the life of Paul. All books are provided by the class. They meet in the Friendship Hall. The class is taught by Jason McDonald.
- \*\* Voyager Class: This is an interactive class that chooses a book to read and to discuss together. This fall the class is reading and discussing the book <u>Living With Confidence In A Chaotic World</u>. The book is by David Jeremiah and talks about having hope in uncertain times. All books are provided for the class. The class meets in the conference room.

Each month we like to highlight the importance of attending Sunday School. This information is taken from the pamphlet **27 Reason Why You Should Attend Sunday School**. Rodney Pry, the Director of the PA State Sunday School Association, shares this information in the pamphlet that he wrote.

This month we would like to highlight Sunday School Helps People Learn the Importance of Gathering together with others for Worship and Learning.

"And let the peace that comes from Christ rule in your hearts. For as members of one body you are all called to live in peace. And always be thankful." (Colossians 3:15)

Can a person be a Christian without joining or attending a church? Some years ago the *Wesleyan Christian Advocate* magazine responded to this question with the following answer: "Yes, it is possible. It is something like being:

A student who will not go to school.

A soldier who will not join the army.

A citizen who does not pay taxes or vote.

A salesman with no customers.

A tuba player without an orchestra.

A parent without a family.

A football player without a team.

A bee without a hive.

Coming together for fellowship, worship and learning with others in the church and Sunday School should not be seen as an option. It is God's plan for us, His children, and His will for us as we interact with others and Him.

In Deuteronomy 31:12, God gave this command to Moses, "Call them all together men, women, children, and the foreigners living in your towns so they may listen and learn to fear the Lord your God and carefully obey all the terms of this law."



Why did God issue such a command? Was it only for God's benefit? Certainly not! God wanted the Israelites and us to learn about His Word and how to live by it each day. And that is the message that He wants each of us to hear today!

#### **Sunday School Reaches Out!**

**K/1st Grade:** Our class has been doing different stories in the Bible. However, there is the central theme of family and friends. We circle together to pray for the opening.

**K/1st Grade Cont**: I am encouraging each child to add a small prayer for someone. **Emilee Bearese, Lachlan Bearese & Michael McDonald** are very close to memorizing their verse. All the children are enthusiastic about studying the Word of God.

**2nd & 3rd Grade:** Our class has been learning about living "God's Way." God loves us so very much and knows what's best for each of us, so it's truly the right way to live!

4th -5th Grade: An idol is anything more important to us than God. In Exodus 20:22-24. The Lord told Moses to tell the people: "You have seen for yourselves that I have spoken to you from heaven: Do not make any gods to be alongside me; do not make for yourselves gods of silver or gods of gold." "Make an altar of earth for me and sacrifice on it. Wherever I cause my name to be honored, I will come to you and bless you." "Worship the Lord your God and serve him only. (Luke 4:8).

God wants to live in us. "Then have them make a sanctuary for me, and I will dwell among them (Exodus 25:8.) As the Israelites wandered in the desert, they often failed to appreciate that God was with them. I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. (Ephesians 3:16-17)

We can follow God when others don't. In Numbers 13 and 14, Moses sent out twelve spies to look at the promised land and the people living there. Ten of the men did not trust the Lord to be with them. As a result, the Israelites wandered in the desert for forty years until all of that generation died. "Choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve." (Joshua 24:15).

Trusting God takes Courage. God chose Joshua to lead the Israelites. In the book of Joshua, we find stories of spies, battles, victories, and defeats. But most of all, it is the story of one man's deep and total trust in God. "Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go (Joshua 1:9).

Middle School Class: In October. looked at what the Bible is, how it is structured, why we read it and how to read it. We talked about truth and how to determine what the truth is. We played the game two truths and a lie to illustrate this. The idea of the game is to state three things about yourself, but with one of them being a lie. You state them to the class and the class has to figure out which one is a lie. Lots of fun trying to figure it out. The idea here is how do you figure out the lie. What clues do you use? In the same way, we can apply these ideas to beliefs. How can you tell what is true and what is a lie? How can we use the ideas of the game to help us figure out what is true and false about religious beliefs? How do we know what we believe is true? We looked at what other religions believe and what Christians believe. Lots of good questions and discussion were had!

High School Class: We are doing a video and book study entitled "Feed The Dog." This is a study on Spiritual Disciplines.
