Dear Friends,

As we have now entered Lent, may this season of the church year be a blessing to you. We talk here at St. Andrew about being intentional about your faith. Here are some ways that you can focus on your faith during this next forty days.

--Fasting and Prayer. In our world today that is all about giving into our desires, we have lost the power of self-control. Fasting is a means by which we gain self-control in our lives. Fasting can be anything from fasting from food to fasting from something that eats up too much of your day. Fasting from food or other items such as videos can involve fasting for a period of time such as a morning to a day. It can also involve fasting from a specific food such as chocolate or dessert or fast food. While fasting, when the hunger pangs or desire hits, use that moment to pray. While praying, God will be the center of your thoughts which mean that your desires will not be. The end result will be greater self-control and deeper faith.

--Meditation. This involves opening your mind to the greater reality of who God is. To achieve this, you will need to seek to shut out any competing voices so that you can hear the voice of God. One of the ways of doing this is to close your eyes and begin to focus on your breathing. As you breathe, think of a word that can be attached to your breathing in and then breathing out. You can think Jesus in and Christ out or Christ is and cross out. This trains your mind to look up to the person of God. As you ponder and meditate, allow God to present thoughts to you such as someone that is in need or that you need to seek forgiveness or a sin that you need to remove. During this time, God will move you to a deeper awareness of His goodness.

--Scripture Study. The difference between this and just reading the Bible is the intent and focus. Scripture Study is focused on a concept or a theological point. For instance, you want to look at all of the prophecies concerning the promised Messiah. You would begin to look up on the internet or in a concordance, words that would fulfill this search such as shoot of David or coming Messiah or eternal king. Then once you have found one, look in the scriptural references attached to that verse. Each time that you go to another verse, check to see what other verses it references. You are now on the journey of your Scriptural Study.

As we live this way, we fulfill our destiny of being rooted in love, grounded in grace, and thus growing for God.

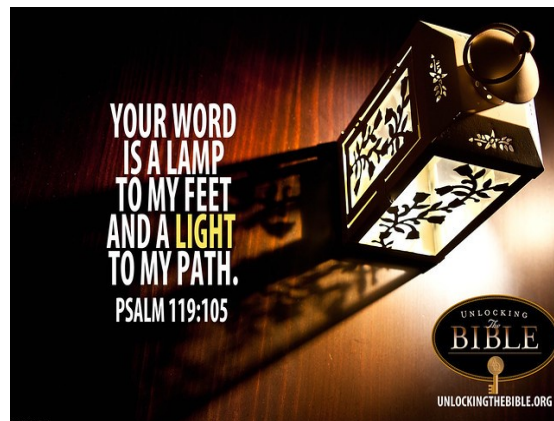

Sunday School

We have 3 Adult Classes:

The Voyager Class: is an interactive Sunday School Class that chooses a book, reads and discusses it together in class. The class has just started a Max Lucado book called, **"Glory Days-Living Your Promised Life Now"**. Books are provided for each class member. The class meets in the conference room.

The Seeker Class: is an in depth Bible study led by Pastor Mark and Hank Hemphill. They are currently studying **Galatians**. This class meets in the Legacy Hall.

The Parenting Class: is an interactive class that is facilitated by Pam & Jason McDonald. The class is using the book, **"Mama Bear Apologetics"**, by Hilary Morgan Ferrer. Books are provided for each class member. This class will help parents to raise their children to think critically, love Biblically, and stand firm against the cultural tide. This class meets in the Friendship Hall.

All children in grades 5 and under meet each week in the sanctuary for a brief opening from 9:45-10:00. During the opening, the children recite the Pledge to the Bible, Pledge to the Christian flag, have a devotion and a time of prayer. An offering is also taken up at this time. The Sunday School offering goes to support our 2 children that we sponsor through Compassion International, various projects from Samaritan's Purse, as well as support the ministry of our church and the community. At 10:00 the children are dismissed to their classes. Parents, please note, if you have children in 3rd grade or below, please pick them up from their Sunday School classes at 10:45.

Sunday School Snippets:

Pre-K Class: Congratulations to Addi Majeski, Aiden Paul, Oliver Gogan, and Luna Leopold for memorizing their Bible verse: *"The Lord is God. It is He who made us"* Psalm 100:3. The class has been studying the Creation story and How God has created us.

Kindergarten/1st Grade: Welcome back, Miss Libby! Miss Libby has been out for the last 2 months and we are so glad to have her back with us! The class has been studying the Creation story. They have been studying how God created each person special and unique with special gifts and talents that God has given to them. Their memory verse is *"I will praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made."* Psalm 139:14

2nd and 3rd Grade: The students are doing a wonderful job in reading the lessons aloud. The class has been studying the miracles of Jesus' healings. The class heard about Jesus healing the paralyzed man by the pool. They also learned about Jesus raising Jarius' daughter from her death.

4th & 5th Grade: The themes that the 4th and 5th graders are studying are: Don't just listen to the Word, do what it says, (Matthew 7:24-27) and build your house upon the rock. We all have abilities to use for the Glory of God (I Corinthians 12:5). We need to show love to those who seem least important, (Matthew 25:40). God wants us to treasure Him more than anything else. *"When you have done it to the least of these my brethren, You have done it unto me."* (Matthew 6:33).
