At the Cross and at the empty tomb, lives are changed as indicated by these books.

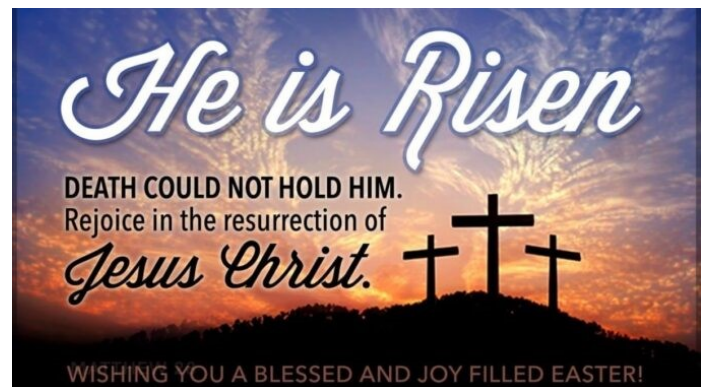

Sunday School

The Voyager's Sunday School Class: meets in the Conference Room. They are reading and discussing the book, "**Glory Days**" by Max Lucado. All books are provide to the class members.

The Seeker's Sunday School Class: meets in the Legacy Hall. This is an in depth Bible Study led by Pastor Mark and Hank Hemphill. They are currently studying Galatians.

The Parenting Class: is held in the Friendship Hall. This class is taught by Pam and Jason McDonald. They are reading and discussing the book **Mama Bear Apologetics**. This class helps parents/grandparents equip their children/grandchildren with knowing God's Word in the midst of a secular and worldly culture. Books are provided for class members.

All classes run from 9:45-10:45 each Sunday. Children in grades 5 and under meet each week in the sanctuary for a brief opening. Please note, if you have a child in 3rd grade or lower, please pick your child up from their classroom at 10:45. If you have any questions, see Mark or Annette.

Sunday School Snippets:

Pre-K Class: Congratulations to the Pre-K students, Oliver Gogan, Addi Majeski, and Aiden Paul, who memorized their Bible verse "**Worship the Lord**", **Psalm 96:9**. The students have been studying that we can worship the Lord by reading God's Word, and through music and prayer.

2nd and 3rd Grade: Through the Bible passages we are studying in Matthew, Mark, Luke and John the students are traveling with Jesus to the cross. We were at the Passover meal when Jesus washed His disciples feet, when Jesus broke bread and poured wine explaining what it meant. This was also the time when Judas, one of His disciples betrayed him to the religious leaders for 30 pieces of silver.

4th & 5th Grade: We follow Jesus (our good shepherd) because we know Him. (John 10:1-6, 14 and Psalm 23). Jesus willingly died to save us. (John 10:7-18). Jesus is our promised king as He was acknowledged on His triumphal ride into Jerusalem. (Matthew 21:1-11) We need to serve each other with love as Jesus did. Just before His trial and death, Jesus showed His disciples the true meaning of love and unselfish service. (John 13:1-17, 14:15-31).

6th-8th Grade: Class is going great! Lots of activities and discussions. In February we looked at how Jesus includes everyone. He doesn't care what you look like, what you have done, how much money you have, how you dress, He loves you anyway. We talked about ways we can model this in our lives. We talked about titles and what our personal titles would be if we had one like Jesus, the Christ! The kids had some great ideas like "the sleepy" etc. We talked about how we assign titles to other people based on our impressions. Sometimes these titles are not good and what do we do about that. We then talked about the mysteries and paradoxes in the Bible. What is the difference between a contradiction and a paradox. We had a great discussion about the things about GOD that are hard to understand. Chris Lunsford subbed for me at the end of February and did a great job talking about GOD's compassion and how we show compassion.

The kids had a fun time in March learning all about St. Patrick, who he was and what he did. We learned that as a young boy he grew up in the British Isles, was kidnapped, and taken to Ireland. There, he was treated cruelly. At that time Ireland did not know anything of the Christian faith. People had gone before to the people of Ireland to share the Gospel but were unsuccessful. Patrick escaped and went to France. There he studied religion. Patrick had such a burden for the people of Ireland that he wanted to go back to share the Christian faith with them, even though his life may be in danger going back. Patrick wasn't sure how to explain the Christian faith to this pagan country. Patrick used the shamrock which is found all over the country to tell the people of Ireland about Christianity. He explained that although it is one plant it has 3 distinct parts. He illustrated that the plant is God and each leaf represents a different aspect of God: Got the Father (Creator), God the Son/Jesus (Savior), and God the Holy Spirit, (Comforter). He died on March 17th, 461 and the church made him a Saint because he spread Christianity to a pagan country and led thousands to Christianity.

The kids had lots of fun doing a lot of shamrock activities and seeing that there are 3 leaves to a shamrock, yet it is one plant. This was an easy way to explain the Trinity to the children. We also used an egg to explain the trinity, 1 egg, but 3 distinct parts, the shell, the yolk, and the white. The Trinity can be a difficult concept, but when illustrated with shamrocks and eggs it all comes together.

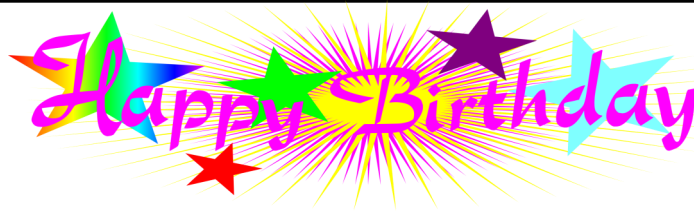
