Dear Friends,

We will celebrate the Remembrance of the Saints on November 2 at both services. We will highlight the importance of our Reformed roots as well as remember the saints in our congregation who have gone on to be with the Lord in this past year.

We Presbyterians have a faith that is called Reformed. It is Reformed in the sense that we always follow the mandate of Scripture as our guide and rule. During the Reformation, the rallying cry was Sola Scriptura or Scripture Alone.

As such, we are wary of human doctrines and ideas that stray from the core of the Scriptures. If a new idea is not in congruence with the Word of God, then we do not accept it as part of who we are as the people of God. This thought is found in our reliance upon the thought that we exist to give glory to God through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

We proclaim this each and every Sunday as we worship and fellowship together. We do things that reach the world. We feed the poor. We speak for those who have no voice. But we do all of these to fulfill our responsibility to the Lord of our hearts.

When we do these things that we just mentioned for our glory and our pride, then we have lost our way. When our sole focus is to grow in numbers and not disciples, we have lost our way. Remember that we exist to give Christ the glory and if we grow, it is to give God the glory for enhancing our growth.

This is the reason that we talk so much about Jesus Christ here—He is the reason for our existence as we are His body demonstrating His love in this world. When we feed the poor or speak for the voiceless or touch those in unhealthy relationships or love our little ones, we are doing so that Christ is given the credit and due for His Spirit being with us. This means reaching out to those who may be different than us and may look different than us as we are not creating a homogeneous worship space but a place where Christ is lifted up through our actions!

When we share our faith in love with those we know and those we don't, as we share in love, we demonstrate to others that we as a people are rooted in love, grounded in grace, and thus growing for God.

Sunday School

If you haven't joined a Sunday School Class yet, come and join us. Here is a brief overview of our Sunday School Program. All students from Grade 5 and below meet in the sanctuary at 9:45 for a brief opening. (all other classes go directly to their Sunday School class at 9:45). During this time, we recite the Pledge to the Christian Flag and to the Bible, have a devotion, and a time of prayer. We also take up an offering. We use our Offering to support 2 sponsored children from the organization, Compassion Internation. We also send money to Samaritan's Purse, a relief organization that provides food, water, medical supplies, etc. to the neediest areas of the world. Part of the money is used for church and local needs. At 10:00 the students are dismissed to their classes.

We have 3 Adult Classes for you to choose from:

- ** Seekers Class: This is an in-depth study of the Bible. They are studying the book of I Thessalonians. The class meets in the Legacy Hall and is taught by Pastor Mark and Hank Hemphill.
- ** Study in Paul: This class is studying the Life of Paul. They are using curriculum from Beth Moore. This is a DVD and book study of the life of Paul. All books are provided by the class. They meet in the Friendship Hall, the class is taught by Jason McDonald.
- ** Voyager Class: This is an interactive class that chooses a book to read and to discuss together. This fall the class will be reading and discussing the book <u>Living With Confidence In A Chaotic World</u>. The book is by David Jeremiah and talks about having hope in uncertain times. All books are provided for the class. The class meets in the conference room.

Each month we like to highlight the importance of attending Sunday School. This information is taken from the pamphlet **27 Reason Why You Should Attend Sunday School**. Rodney Pry, the Director of the PA State Sunday School Association, shares this information in the pamphlet that he wrote.

Sunday School Calls Individuals to Give Thanks and Praise to God.

"No matter what happens, always be thankful, for this is God's will for you who belong to Christ Jesus." I Thessalonians 5:18

Eleanor Doan relates the following story in one of her books: "Matthew Henry, the famous Bible scholar, was once accosted by thieves and robbed of his purse. That same day he wrote these words in his diary: "Let me be thankful first because I was never robbed before; second, although they took my purse, they did not take my life; third, because, although they took my all, it was not much; and fourth, because it was I who was robbed, not I who robbed.

When a Sunday School Teacher once asked her class what they were thankful for; one little boy replied, "My glasses." He explained "They keep the other boys from hitting me and the girls from kissing me."

Thankfulness comes in many different forms for different people. For Matthew Henry, his thankfulness seemed to be unmerited, but for the little boy, it was for the personal benefits that his glasses provided.

What are you thankful for today? I'm sure you are thankful for the many blessings that God has granted to you and your family. But, are you also thankful for the unpleasant and bad things that happen to you?



In Romans 8:28, Paul reminds us that "..everything works together for the good of those who love God and are called according to His purpose for them." Being thankful for all things involves learning to recognize the "good" result that God promised will come from the situation.

Learning to recognize and be thankful for all of God's blessings, both the good and the bad, only comes from a deep personal relationship with God and an indepth knowledge and understanding of the Bible. And, where can you get that knowledge and understanding of the Bible? In Sunday School!

In all things let us give thanks to God for all the blessings that He has bestowed down upon us.

K/1st Grade: Our class has been doing different stories in the Bible. However, there is the central theme of family and friends. We circle together to pray for the opening.



K/1st Grade Cont: I am encouraging each child to add a small prayer for someone. **Emilee Bearese, Laken Bearese & Michael McDonald** are very close to memorizing their verse. All the children are enthusiastic about studying the Word of God.

2nd & 3rd Grade: Our class has been learning about how God chose Moses to lead His people out of slavery in Egypt. (Exodus 3-10) Moses, being unsure of his speaking skills, didn't think the Israelites would believe him. God told Moses that He would give him amazing signs to perform and that they would then believe him. "My grace is sufficient for you for my power is made perfect in weakness." (II Corinthians 12:9) God's plan to free the Israelites involved 10 plaques upon Egypt. Though these plaques were being cast upon the country, Pharoh initially would not let God's people go. However, Moses and his brother Aaron kept trusting God and trying never to giving up. "Let us not become weary in doing good." (Galatians 6:9)

4th -5th Grade: We have been studying the life of Moses from childhood through crossing the Red Sea and entering into the desert. Each week we focused on one of the following themes:

- 1. God wants us to do things His way (Exodus 1:7-2:15)
- 2. He wants us to do what we think we can't do (3:1-4:20)
- 3. God is in control so don't give up (5:1-10:29)
- 4. **God fulfills His promises** (Exodus 11:1 12:42)
- 5. God can help us in hopeless times (13:17-15:22)
- 6. **Grumbling gets us nowhere** (Exodus 15:23 17:7, Numbers 20:1-13)

Middle School: It is a new school year and a new class! So...back to basics. What is a Christian? Why are we Christians? What is the Bible? Why do we believe in a 2000+ year old book? We dove into the answers to all of these questions. We looked at what we have with Jesus that other people are missing out on forgiveness, peace, purpose, etc. We talked about how nonbeliever's go through life blind and how we have the advantage of going through life with our eyes open. We illustrated this by doing an exercise walking around the church blindfolded, then blindfolded with someone guiding us and then with our eyes wide open. Much better with your eyes open. We looked at the Bible and why it is still relevant even now. Simply, the Bible is GODs word, GOD doesn't change so His word is always true. Lots of other fun stuff! Stay tuned for more goings on in October!
