So, in the days ahead, may our love speak to the hearts who know love best, by kindness, by compassion, by simple courtesy and daily thoughtfulness. Bless her who's name we whisper before Thee, and keep her in Thy perfect peace, through Jesus Christ, our Lord, Amen."

May we remember this month—those who loved us and gave of their heart to us, our mothers, and those who sacrificed their lives for our freedoms and as we do so, we will demonstrate that we are rooted in love, grounded in grace, and thus growing for God.

Your Stewardship at Work: <u>Mission Committee</u>

Let's continue learning how your stewardship works with the Mission committee.

The Mission Committee's responsibilities follow several directives from Jesus before He ascended.

The Mission Committee supports those who go into the world and preach the gospel (Mark 16:15), including Jed Koball, Presbyterian Mission Worker in Peru; Pakistan Education Board; Fellowship of Christian Athletes; and the Williamsport Ministerium. They also promote special offerings with Moments for Missions: One Great Hour of Sharing, Thanksgiving Offering, and Joy Offering.

The Mission Committee has many ways to take care of the "lambs" and "sheep" in our community. (John 21:14-17)

Promotes community outreach opportunities: Micah's Backpack, Habitat for Humanity, Salvation Army's Women and Children Shelter, CASA, and Fire and Ambulance Rescue services.

Coordinates and delivers school supplies to three Williamsport schools twice yearly.

Supports the Williamsport Food Pantry with monthly food donations and coordinates volunteers six times a year as well as paying the Food Pantry's monthly rent once a year.

Supports Williamsport Ministerium's Harvest Hoe Down (Food Pantry Fundraiser) by coordinating the Scarecrow Making booth.

The offering also goes toward the ministry of the church when there is a need as well as mission projects in our local area. 
Sunday School Snippets

Pre-K Class: Congratulations to **Emilia and Lachlan Bearese**, and **Maddie Goodwin** for memorizing their Bible verse; "*Jesus lives forever*." Hebrews 7:24". The class is studying the Creation Story starting with God making the plants and the seasons.

Kindergarten/1st Grade Class: Congratulations to *Nikolai Bearese, Aiden Paul*, and *Thomas Twum-Barimah* for memorizing their Bible verse "*Everything God created is good.*" I Timothy 4:4. The class is studying the creation story.

2nd & 3rd Grade: Our class has been studying ways in which we can remind ourselves that God always listens when we pray, always cares, and always proves Himself trustworthy, in giving us the very help we truly need. I Peter 5:7 "*Cast all your anxiety on Him because He cares for you.*" Moreover, our class has been learning, the wonderful significance of Palm Sunday, The Last Supper, Good Friday and Easter Sunday. Jesus died on the cross for the forgiveness of our sins. And "*He has risen just as he said.*" Matthew 28:6-7. Indeed, Jesus is alive and with us today! The Good News" is the "Best news ever"!! Jesus always loves us and we can joyfully share this wonderful news with all! Praise be to God! In Jesus name. Amen. **Elsie Majeski** essentially taught the Sunday School lesson of the day in sharing her "true to scripture account" of (I Kings 18:16-40) where the prophet Elijah proved that our Heavenly Father is the one and only true God. **Kohen Dayhoff** drew an amazing illustration of Palm Sunday, Easter Sunday and that of Elijah praying the widow's son back to life (I Kings 17:17-24). **Elsie Majeski** also presented a beautiful illustration of Easter morning in brilliant watercolors.

4th and 5th Grade: Nineveh was the capital city of the Assyrian Empire and known as a large and evil city. God told Jonah to go to Nineveh to turn the people from their evil ways. Jonah did not want to minister to Nineveh and ended up inside a great fish for three days and three nights. God rescued Jonah and told him to go to Nineveh with the message of God's judgment and forgiveness for Israel. The people repented; however, Jonah was not ready to accept God's compassion for others outside of Israel. (Jonah 1— 4) Our focus: God wants us to care about people we do not really like. Love your neighbor like yourself. (Matthew 22:39).



Amos was a prophet of God who carried God's message to the northern kingdom of Israel. When Amos arrived, he found that not only was God neglected, but the usual Hebrew ideas of decency and honesty were also being ignored. The Israelites thought they were righteous; but they took bribes, hurt those who did right, perverted justice and sold innocent people into slavery. Amos's message was a call to repentance. He pointed out their sins and encouraged them to return to the Lord. Amos 5:6 and 14-15. Our focus: Hate evil, love good. (Amos 5:15).

Esther was a beautiful young Jewish woman at a time when the Jewish nation was living in exile in Persia. Persia was the greatest world power. When her cousin, Mordecai, and her people came under attack and were scheduled to be killed, Esther risked her life and made a stand for God and His people. (Esther 2:17–9:5) Focus: Take a stand for God. "Do not be afraid. Stand firm and you will see the deliverance the Lord will bring you today." (Exodus 14:13)

Middle School: Class is going great! Lots of activities and discussions. In March we looked at the idea of Rebellion. Human history and the Bible are a story of rebellion. Starting with Adam and Eve and the apple all the way through to Jesus. Jesus was a rebel! He didn't seek to get along, he came to fulfil the prophesies and to create a new covenant. We are also charged to be rebels in this world, but not the kind that the world expects or promotes. We looked at what the world tells us to do in our lives and what Jesus tells us. The world tells us an eye for an eye, Jesus tells us to turn the other check. The world tells us to hate our enemies, Jesus tells us to love them. Just by following Jesus, you set yourself apart. Embrace your rebellion against the ways of the world. Love God and your neighbor and let the Jesus rebellion grow!
