At the Baltimore Processing Center, there is a final precheck before the boxes go on to their destination.

In 2023, our boxes went to the Dominican Republic and in 2024 they went to Tanzania. At this point, we don't know where they will wind up. But, I can tell you that as part of a global outreach, the US sent 10 million of the 11.3 million collected last year. That's 10 million opportunities to reach children for Jesus in 100 countries in 107 languages.

Here is what is happening in Sunday School:

Toddler Class: Is studying the importance of the Bible and its stories of Jesus. Congratulations to **Luka Bearese** who is doing a great job of adjusting to the Sunday School routine.

<u>Pre-K Class:</u> This class has been studying all about Jesus:

** Jesus knows who we are. ** Jesus listens when we ask for Him to help.. ** Jesus is a friend to everyone. ** Jesus wants us to follow Him.

The class is learning what it means to have a personal relationship with Jesus. The children are continuing to memorize their Bible verses. This month they will be memorizing Mark 10:27 "All things are possible with God."

Congratulation to **Bryan Twum-Barimah** and to **Lachlan Bearese** who memorized: "He cares for you." I Peter 5:7. Congratulations to Bryan who had perfect attendance in September and to Lachlan who only missed 1 Sunday in September.

K/1st Grade: The students are learning that Jesus is the Son of God. They are learning of the great power that Jesus has. The class studied the many miracles that Jesus performed: ** He calmed the storm ** He healed a sick man, ** He healed a blind man. The class is memorizing the Bible verse: "Anyone who sees Me sees the Father." John 14:9. Congratulation to **Emilia Bearese**, **Michael McDonald**, and **Aiden Paul** for the great participation and attentiveness in class.

2nd & 3rd Grade: "Do you not know? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the end of the Earth." Isaiah 40:28. Our class has been studying our wonderfully loving God most

high, awe, inspiring Biblical account of His perfect plan in creation. We moreover have begun... learning how sin entered the amazing world God created, how disobedience has consequences, yet how gracious and merciful God is, in correcting us and teaching us to do the right thing. "Bless is the one whom God corrects" Job 5:17. It is my honor to congratulate Elsie Majeski, Addi Majeski, Thomas Twum-Barimah, Jr and Nikolai Bearse in being about to step-by-step (all 7 days) relay God's marvelous story of creation in all its beauty and splendor.

As we embark in our studying of The Biblical Account of "Noah's Ark" (Genesis 6:9-7:24) we will be rehearing a puppet show rendition, stay tuned.

4th and 5th Grade: We have been exploring Creation in Genesis 1 and 2. We have discussed how God created with great power, order, wisdom, and love. God's Holy Spirit was hovering over the waters, and Christ was there, as nothing was created without Christ. From nothing, God spoke everything into existence. On day one, He said, "Let there be light" and there was light. The light came from Him because the sun, moon, and stars were not created until day four.

On the third day God created land and vegetation (food). On the fifth day God made the waters swarm with fish and sea creatures and filled the sky with birds of every kind.

God created every kind of plant, tree, fish, sea creature, bird, and all land animals who produced offspring after their own kind. God also created male and female, able to produce offspring after their kind. He made man in His image. Unlike the rest of His creation, God formed Adam and breathed the breath of life into Adam's nostrils, and he became a living person.



God gave Adam a helper and Adam named her woman. God blessed them and gave them dominion over His creation and God said, "It was very good."

On the seventh day, God rested from all His work.

We will be studying the following themes: "We all need God's correction" (Jeremiah 10:24), "We can choose the right attitude when corrected" (Rev. 3:19), Sin grieves God, but following God pleases Him. (Psalm 145:17), "God Promises to save") (Ephesians 2:8), "God directs our ways." (Psalm 32:8).

Middle School: We started this year's Sunday School class from the beginning, literally. We started with creation. How science actually supports and proves that GOD created the universe whether the scientific community likes it or not. We looked at all of the accidents that had to happen for a universe to be created without a creator. Next we looked at humans and how we were created in the image of GOD and what that means. We looked at how that fact sets us apart from all the rest of GOD's creations. We did a fun thought experiment where we tried to think about if we were the creator of humans, what would we do differently? My suggestion was to give us tails. How much fun would it be to have a tail! The kids had some other really great ideas. Lastly we looked at the earth and how GOD gave us humans dominion over it and charged us to subdue it. We explored what this really means, and how people have misinterpreted what this means through the years. What the difference is between using and managing the creation GOD has given us and exploiting GOD's gifts.

<u>Teen Class:</u> The class has been looking at everyday problems they face and how to apply the Bible to them.
